## OVERALL ENROLLMENT IN PREP COURSES

College prep headcount has gone up significantly the last two fall terms, as compared to the previous fall term. In Fall 2001, prep headcount districtwide was up nearly 15%. This was on top of a 16% increase from Fall 1999 to Fall 2000.

At the campus level, Belle Glade prep headcount has nearly doubled in the last two years, while Boca Raton had 44% more prep students in Fall 2001 than in Fall 1999.

## DEMOGRAPHICS

### Race/ethnicity

Prep students tend to skew disproportionately toward minorities, as compared to the overall population of the College. On a district basis, in Fall 2001, only 46% of prep students are white, while 31% are black and 17% Hispanic.

Minority students make up the majority of prep students at three of the four campuses. At Belle Glade, more than four in five (83%) are members of minority groups.

**Gender**

The gender of prep students is in line with the College's overall profile. Sixty percent of prep students in Fall 2001 are female.

**Age**

Almost three-quarters (72%) of prep students are in the traditional college age range of 18 to 25. The average age of a prep student is 23.7 years, while the median is 20 years.

Students at Boca Raton are the youngest among prep students (average age: 22.4), while those in Belle Glade are the oldest (average age: 26.8).

## CHARACTERISTICS OF PREP STUDENTS

### Credit earned

Nearly half (45%) of prep students had less than six hours of credit earned as of the end of the Fall 2001 term. In addition, nearly all (92%) would be classified as freshmen, as they had fewer than 30 hours of credit earned.

On average, prep students had earned a total of ten hours of credit. Those at Belle Glade had earned slightly more credit (average credit: 11.9 hours), while Boca Raton students had slightly less (average credit: 7.9 hours).

**Term credit load**

The term course loads of prep students are roughly split between full-and part-time. At the district level, 57% of prep students are part-time, meaning they were enrolled for less than 12 hours.

Part-time students make up the majority of prep students at all four campuses. Students at Lake Worth had the largest course load, on average (9.1 hours), while Boca Raton students had the lightest load (8.5 hours). The load difference at Boca Raton could be a result of Florida Atlantic University students taking only prep courses at PBCC, while taking the bulk of their load at FAU.

**Grade-point average**

Among prep students with more than 12 hours attempted toward their grade-point averages, about half (49%) had GPAs below 2.5. The average GPA for prep students, as of the end of the Fall 2001 term, was 2.44.

Students at Belle Glade had the highest GPAs among the four campuses (average GPA: 2.54), while those at Boca Raton had somewhat lower GPAs (average GPA: 2.32).

**Awards sought**

About two-thirds (67%) of prep students were seeking an associate in arts degree. An additional 19% were seeking the associate in science or associate in applied science. Thirteen percent of students were classified as non-award seeking. Very few prep students were found in vocational certificate areas because prep coursework is not normally required for most fields.

Naturally, the awards sought tend to vary with programs offered on each campus. At Belle Glade, where few vocational programs are offered, most prep students seek the AA. Meanwhile, at Boca Raton, many FAU students get preparatory coursework through PBCC and are not seeking a formal award from PBCC.

**Financial aid**

About a third (32%) of prep students were on some form of financial aid - most of them on the Pell Grant.

The level of financial aid use tends to vary with the economics of the area served by each campus. In economically-depressed Belle Glade, about two-thirds (68%) were on financial aid, while Boca Raton students, likelier to be from a more affluent area, had the fewest prep students on financial aid.

**High school of origin**

As would be expected, Palm Beach County schools make up the largest portion of the prep population at PBCC. Almost half (47%) went to a public or private high school in the county. Nine percent came from Broward county schools, while 11% earned Florida GEDs. More than a quarter came from out-of-state high schools.

At two campuses, school systems outside the service area provide many students in need of remediation. At Boca Raton, 24% of prep students came from Broward County, while 8% of Belle Glade prep students came from Hendry County public schools.

## ACCOUNTABILITY DATA

### College prep passing rates

According to the *Palm Beach Community College Accountability Measure Outcomes, Trend Analysis, 1997-2001*, two-thirds (67%) of Fall 1998 degree-seeking first-time-in-college students or previous-year high school graduates failed at least one entry-level subtest. This figure has been fairly steady over the last five years.

By Summer 2001, 73% of those students tracked in the Fall 1998 cohort had passed their highest level reading prep course, while 71% had passed the highest English prep course, and 57% had completed preparatory math. These figures all are higher than the state averages and have been for the last five years.

### Graduation, retention, success

Among first-time-in-college prep students tracked from Fall 1997 through Spring 2001, who had completed their preparatory work within two years and earned 18 hours of credit, 28% had graduated with an AA by Spring 2001.

In addition, 63% were considered retained, meaning they had either graduated or were still enrolled. Also, 72% percent were considered successes, in that they had either graduated during the tracking period or were still enrolled in good standing or left in good standing.

Among associate in science students tracked during the same period, 12% had graduated by Spring 2001, while 67% were retained and 72% were successes. These numbers have fluctuated over the last five years due to the low number of students in the PBCC cohorts and also possibly due to changes or additions to AS programs.

## GRADE DISTRIBUTION OF COURSES

The overall passing rate in prep courses at PBCC in Fall 2001 was 61%. Passing rates in EAP prep were much higher (80%) than for regular prep courses (57%).

In regular prep courses, reading prep had the highest passing rate (72%) of the three areas. English prep showed a 59% passing rate, while math prep students passed only 49% of the time.
