

Guidelines for APA Format: 5th Edition

- arrange alphabetically by author's last name, initials are used for first and middle names
- anonymous works are arranged by the first significant word in the title
- capitalize only the first word of the article title and of the subtitle, if any, and any proper nouns double-space all reference entries
- double-space all reference entries
- indent the second and successive lines five spaces
- copyright date follows the author's name in parenthesis (2001)

Periodicals

Journal article, one author (see p. 240)

Journal article, two authors, journal paginated by issue (see p. 240)

Klimorski, R., & Palmer, S. (1993). The ADA and the hiring process in organizations. *Consulting Psychology Journal: Practice and Research*, *45*(2), 10-36.

Magazine article (see p. 241)

Kandel, E. R. & Squire, L. R. (2000, November 10). Neuroscience: breaking down scientific barriers to the study of brain and mind. *Science*, *290*, 1113-1120.

Daily newspaper article, no author (see p. 242)

New drug appears to sharply cut risk of death from heart failure. (1993, July 15). *The Washington Post*, p. A12.

Books

Reference to an entire book (see p. 248)

Beck, C. A. J., & Sales, B. D. (2001). *Family mediation: Facts, myths, and future prospects*. Washington, DC: American Psychological Association.

Book, group author (government agency) as publisher (see p. 248-249)

Australian Bureau of Statistics. (1991). *Estimated resident population by age and sex in statistical local areas, New South Wales, June 1990* (no. 3209.1). Canberra, Australian Capital Territory: Author.

Edited book (see p. 249)

Gibbs, J. T., & Huang, L. N. (Eds.). (1991). *Children of color: psychological interventions with minority youth*. San Francisco: Jossey-Bass.

Several volumes in a multivolume edited work, publication over period of more than 1 year (see p. 250)

Koch, S. (Ed.). (1959-1963). *Psychology: A study of science* (Vols. 1-6). New York: McGraw-Hill.

Reference to an article or chapter in an edited book (see p. 252)

Massaro, D. (1992). Broadening the domain of the fuzzy logical model of perception. In H. L. Pick Jr., P. van den Broek, & D. C. Knill (Eds.), *Cognition: Conceptual and methodological issues* (pp. 51-84). Washington, DC: American Psychological Association.

Entry in an encyclopedia (see p. 254)

Bergmann, P. G. (1993). Relativity. In *The new encyclopaedia Britannica* (Vol. 26, pp. 501-508). Chicago: Encyclopaedia Britannica.

Electronic Media

Internet articles based on a print source (see p. 271)

VandenBos, G., Knapp, S., & Doe, J. (2001). Role of reference elements in the selection of resources by psychology undergraduates [Electronic version]. *Journal of Bibliographic Research*, 5, 117-123.

Electronic copy of a journal article, three to five authors, retrieved from a database (see p. 279)

Borman, W. C., Hanson, M. A., Oppler, S. H., Pulakos, E. D., & White, L. A. (1993). Role of early supervisory experience in supervisor performance. *Journal of Applied Psychology*, 78, 443—449. Retrieved October 23, 2000, from PsycARTICLES database.

Article in an Internet-only journal (see p. 272)

Fredrickson, B. L. (2000, March 7). Cultivating positive emotions to optimize health and well-being. *Prevention & Treatment*, 3, Article 0001a. Retrieved November 20, 2000, from <http://journals.apa.org/prevention/volume3/pre0030001a.html>

Stand-alone document, no author identified, no date (see p. 274)

Document available on university program or department web site (see p. 274)

APA-Format Citations with Annotations

Gaw, A. C. (Ed.). (1993). *Culture, ethnicity and mental illness*. Washington, DC: American Psychiatric Press.

Examines the expression and treatment of mental illness in the context of culture, with chapters on African Americans, American Indians, Asian Americans, Hispanic Americans, women, ethnic elders, and gay men and lesbians. Glossaries of ethnic terms are offered from Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Filipino, Mexican, and Puerto Rican cultures.

Moulton, J., Robinson, G. M., & Elias, C. (1978). Sex bias in language use: “Neutral” pronouns that aren’t. *American Psychologist*, 33, 1032-1036.

Reports data demonstrating that even when used in a supposedly neutral context, “generic” male terms induce people to think of males.
